

SOCIAL INSURANCE NUMBER: SIN

[December 2018]



The Social Insurance Number (SIN) is a nine-digit number that you need to work in Canada or to have access to government programs and benefits.

A SIN is issued to one person only and cannot legally be used by anyone else.

How to Apply

Gather the required original <u>proof-of-identity documents</u> and take them to the nearest Service Canada <u>point of service</u>.

If everything is in order, you will get your Social Insurance Number at the time of your visit.

Important: Obtain a Permanent SIN after Obtaining Permanent Residency Status

- 1) Go to your nearest <u>Service Canada Centre</u>.
- 2) Bring your PR card, or if you have not received this yet, bring your proof of PR document and government issued photo ID from the province in which you live (and your passport).
