

Apprenticeship Systems



Apprenticeship in Canada is regulated by each province and territory. Some provinces require you to be a permanent resident before you can complete an apprenticeship. Canada also has a standard of excellence known as the:

Interprovincial Standards Red Seal Program

It is offered in 55 trades. Through the Program, tradespersons obtain an endorsement on their provincial/territorial certificates by successfully completing an interprovincial exam.
