The Social Insurance Number (SIN) is a nine-digit number that you need to work in Canada or to have access to government programs and benefits.

How to Apply

Gather all the required original proof-of-identity documents and take them to the nearest Service Canada point of service.

You must provide **one** of the following primary documents:

Work permit issued by Citizenship and Immigration Canada (CIC).

OR

<u>Study permit</u> issued by CIC and a <u>contract of employment</u> from the learning institution or employer on campus where you obtained authorization to study by CIC (this contract must show the start and end date of employment and these dates must fall within the study permit dates).

AND

Your passport
